## Literacy

We are continuing with our first unit. We are discussing what makes each student unique. The children are learning to describe themselves, and their friends. We are working towards our final project which is to create a comic strip using the program Bitstrips. The students will physically describe themselves and their family members.

a. Please continue to check and sign your child's agenda every evening to verify that your son/daughter completed homework and that you received messages sent home.

( Just a reminder, please discuss the importance of good listening skills with your child. All of our reading and writing activities are based upon what has been SAID ORALLY during class discussions.

## English Literacy

There is an English period for half an hour each day, for a total of 150 minutes per week.

This year the English curriculum will be incorporated with Health, Social Studies and Science objectives.
For the next two months, we will continue to work on a Social Studies unit about "What makes me feel like part of the community?" We will also be working on descriptive writing.
Please continue to have your child read for 10 minutes in English each night and then record: 1) the title of the book and 2) the number of pages read. A parent must also initial the Daily Reading Log. Please return the Reading Log to school every day.


## Music

Your son or daughter has Music Wednesday afternoon from 11:45-12:15 and Friday morning from 8:45-9:15.

Just a reminder: Upper Elementary Choir (grades 3-
5) will begin this month. Performances will take place during the Remembrance Day assembly and the Christmas Choir Concert in December.

## Physical Education

Your child has Physical Education Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday mornings from 8:15-8:45. Please make sure that your son or daughter is dressed appropriately.

## Yoga

Every Monday from 12:15-12:45 for those students who returned the permission slip.

## Soccer Intramurals

Every Monday from 12:15-12:45 for those students who signed up. There are 4 different teams with 2 games per noon recess.

Please make sure that your child has indoor sneakers in order to be able to participate in these extracurricular activities.

## Fall Running Club

## Cross Country Run

## Math

In Math this month, the students are continuing to learn numbers to 1000 in French. They are also:

- Counting, representing, describing, comparing and ordering numbers to 500 .
- Estimating quantities less than 100 using referents.
- Appling estimation strategies to predict sums and differences of two 2-digit numerals in a problem solving context.
- Illustrating the meaning of place value with numbers to 200.
- Describing and applying mental mathematics strategies for adding two 2-digit numerals such as: adding from left to right, and using doubles
- Describing and applying mental mathematics strategies for subtracting two 2-digit numerals such as: thinking of addition
- Continuing to develop a recall of basic facts
- Demonstrating an understanding of increasing and decreasing patterns by: describing, extending, comparing, creating patterns using manipulatives, diagrams, sounds, and actions (numbers to 200)
- Collecting and organizing first hand data.
- Constructing, labeling, and interpreting bar graphs to solve problems.

4. Math Tip: Have your child practice counting with money (in French)! This is a great way to reinforce counting by $1 \mathrm{~s}, 5 \mathrm{~s}, 10 \mathrm{~s}$ and 25 s .

## Math Homework

As students become more comfortable with saying numbers in French, we will be adding basic math facts to be practiced and reviewed. Each Friday students will have a one minute basic math fact test with 12 questions based on facts studied for homework throughout the week. Students should recall facts quickly (within 3 seconds) in Grade 3.

Please continue to sign your child's Math Homework sheet each night and return it to the school the next day.
